## Bethlehem Lutheran Church

The Church Council has approved the reprinting of the booklet containing pictures of the stained glass windows as well as an explanation of the bible stories depicted in each window. Visitors often comment about the beauty of these windows, so we thought the booklets would be something to share with our visitors and any members wishing to have one. We might also share the booklets with youth in Sunday School or catechism. The cost for reprinting is \$677.00. If anyone is interested in donating to offset the cost, donations may be submitted to the office with a notation to be used for stain-glass booklet reprint.

## Helping Haiti—A Savanette Update from BLCW program March 23

Jan and Jay Nielson have now completed 20 years of service to MIA's mission in Savanette, Haiti. They shared that in spite all the violence and gang chaos that is occurring in Haiti (Por-au-Prince area), the Brad Reddick School (BRS), grades K-11 with 400 students, in the Savanette area (160 miles from the turmoil), is doing well. Other projects including the SAVAFM radio station, sewing center, wedding shop, farm resource center, conference center, Circle of Life business (jewelry etc. from recycled paper), medical clinic, agroforestry, and evangelism ministry events are all operational. Two 8000 gallon water tanks have been erected, the first ever public latrines have been completed, a surgery center is close to completion, rapid growing of bamboo plants continues, and playground equipment from Perrysburg's Woodlands Park, chrome books, lockers, tables, chairs, and science supplies for the school have arrived in containers. They are hoping for more financial support to build and complete the school through grade 13. They also encouraged sponsoring a child at BRS for \$125 a year (tuition, books, uniform) and for \$65, feeding a child at school for a year.

# MARCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



## Reports of Officers:

### Trustee Report-

- survey will be done of Parsonage #2 to verify property lines
- New Boiler is in place & operating, awaiting final inspection
- Getting quotes on Sanctuary roof replacement
- repairs will be made to the East basement wall & floor & in the prayer garden, these will be done in-house, no quotes necessary.
- looking at wooden exterior doors for possible improvements

### Committee Reports:

#### A. Transition Team-

1) Strategic Planning : Emily Croak from Aly Sterling Philanthropy with a Zoom presentation. Assess, Align & Act program. She presented the council with an outline of what they could help us with in creating a strategic plan for Bethlehem. She presented the initial cost structure and what it would include. Council asked if they could use studies & surveys we have already done to be integrated in to their structure & present a new estimate to council.

Motion made by Matt Meyer to submit our previous work to Aly Sterling to get an updated cost estimate. Seconded by Josh Gerwin, Motion passed

2) Beer & Hymns had approx. 50 ppl attending 30 Spring fling was positive, some kids came to church the next morning.

3) Terri Hansen is planning a preschool workshop April 22nd. Maybe have the preschool students sing in church.

#### B. Long Range Planning Committee-

- Will meet to discuss Investment committee reports on BLC investment fund health.
- Will make decisions on distribution of proceeds.

### Old Business:

- **Preschool Security-** did not get the grant they applied for but are exploring security system upgrades independently. Shepard's staff roster-need to get updates linked with Church Directory phone app.
- **Sale of Parsonage #2-** Consideration of renter's appeal to 'delay' the sale of the house. They are not in the position to buy the house but have found it difficult to find an alternative rental opportunity in the Eastwood district. In-depth discussion of the timeline for the sale of the house. Due to the new survey & other issues, it might be 6 months until the home goes on the market. We agreed to keep the renters informed as to the status of listing the home. Travis made a motion that we offer a 12 month lease to the current renters. No second for the motion. Motion fails Conclusion is that although we have sympathy for the renter's difficulty in finding a different situation, the congregation has voted on the sale of the house & we have an obligation to proceed. We will keep lines of communication open with the renters as the sale process moves forward.
- **Chimes-** should be working with a new tablet . We have not had a true test yet.

### New Business:

**A. 1. Financial Secretary position:** the position will be announced in church & posted Not sure where it will be posted yet, newspaper & on-line. Pay range from \$18-22 based on experience with a 6 month review

Motion to outsource the payroll processing: Willie Fisher, second by Karen Korn, motion passed.

**2. Youth protection-**the Boy Scouts of America offers an on-line program, Luanne looked into this option. Sheri Kreiger from the Synod office said she would provide resources on Youth Protection program. Will follow up with the Synod representative to get their feedback on the effectiveness of that program & how far reaching we need to be.

**B. Movie Night.** Russ presented the costs of licensing to show movies to guests. The license is \$322 annually for a wide variety of movies. We will try this out with quarterly movie nights. Bethlehem will offer popcorn & beverages, asking for free-will donations. Motion to proceed made by Ken Gerwin, second by Tim Philabaum-Motion carries

**C. Mudhens night-** Friends & Family night June 30th. Will post to the congregation to sign up for the event.

**D. Stained Glass Window booklet-** People have been asking about the booklet we had.

Motion made to have 250 more printed for approx. \$650 . Willie Fisher made the motion, Karen Korn second – Motion carries

**E. Staffing of the church-** some discussion for if we need to staff the church outside of office hours. Idea to put a 'well informed' easel in front of office with current information -times, activities, contacts, etc -if someone comes in after the office is closed.

**F. Local family in need** that we did the Noisy offering for will get a check for \$678

\$378 from the offering with \$300 match

# FROM BISHOP DANIEL BEAUDOIN



*February 21, 2024  
Keep the Sabbath*

**“Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son, or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore, the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it” (Exodus 20:8-11).**



How do we keep the Sabbath holy? As Lutheran Christians many of us were taught through Luther’s Small Catechism to keep the Sabbath holy by fearing and loving God, **“...so that we do not despise preaching or His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.”** According to Luther, the Sabbath was less about rest and more about attending public worship and making use of God’s Word and Sacraments. Participating in public worship is important. Taking a day for rest is also important. Both practices (worship and rest) are sacred and draw us deeper into a relationship with the living God. We need to worship, and we need to rest.

In Exodus, the keeping of Sabbath is directly tied to work. **“For six days you shall labor and do your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God, and you shall not do any work.”** God’s people are called to a seventh day of rest, as God rested from creation on the seventh day. And not only did God rest, but God also **“blessed the Sabbath Day and consecrated it.”** God made the seventh day holy, and we keep the Sabbath holy through the spiritual practice of rest.

For thousands of years God’s people have put God’s gift of Sabbath rest into practice. And during this season of Lent in this Year of Rest, I’m going to give it a try, or at least “fail forward” in my attempt to keep the Sabbath holy. “Failing forward” is a favorite phrase of mine. When you tinker with a new endeavor, you don’t always succeed the first time. Failing forward is learning from your failure, adapting your approach, and trying it again, and again, and again. Tinker and try long enough and you will learn to master the new practice.

# Happening This Month: April

## April Mission Action Project:

Baby Care Kits include the following items in each Baby Care Kit:

- 2 lightweight cotton t-shirts
- 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- 2 receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn up to 52" square
- 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred,
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pair of socks
- 1 hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 bath size bars (4-5 oz.) of gentle soap, in its original wrapping
- 2 diaper pins OR large safety pins

**Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.** Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

### Tips for Baby Care Kits:

- Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts. Visit [lwr.org](http://lwr.org) for a Diaper Tip Sheet with instructions.
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.


