## Pastor's Message

Greetings, sisters and brothers! So, right smack in the middle of February is "Valentine's Day," the day of love. There it sits, on the 14, reminding us of the love St. Valentine had for his girlfriend, and the love he had for Jesus (as he was then killed for his faith on this day).

This day becomes an important image for the whole month, as well as for our faith. For we believe in and proclaim that God is love, and that all love comes from God.

What makes February 14 also important is that Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent fall on that date. On this "day of love" we will gather to repent of our sins, to receive the imposition of ashes, to begin a 40 day experience of introspection, to spend time in spiritual practices, and to prepare ourselves for the awesome Three Days. We will walk with the disciples during those three days; to the Upper



Room for the Last Supper; then to the Garden, in which Jesus is betrayed; then to the homes of the High Priest and the Roman Governor; then to Calvary, at which Jesus gives His life for the sake of the world. We will continue our walk with Mary Magdalene to the tomb and encounter the Resurrected Christ!

Here we see the plan of love that God began to put into place well before creation was created! It defines us as creatures of this loving God, and call us, like Jesus, to love others as we have been so

awesomely loved!

We have a gift in the Pemberville Community, in that the congregations of this Village are in great partnership. So we will gather with all of them, each Wednesday, to worship our God, to share in Holy Communion, and to proclaim our common faith.

The theme for this year is "Lenten Hymns." Each Pastor/Congregation will choose a hymn around which to focus the service. Such hymns will sing us in faith and strengthen our combined witness. Those who are able to attend the 11am service will be able to share in lunch at the Pemberville Senior Center. Those who will attend the 7pm service may share in supper, beginning at 6pm. Each of the services will be held at Bethlehem.

Blessings to you this season of Lent. May our amazing God bless you as you prepare for the joy of Easter!

## FROM BISHOP DANIEL BEAUDOIN



October 25, 2023  
*Dona Nobis Pacem (Grant Us Peace)*

**“For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace” (Isaiah 9: 6)**

In 2018, I joined a number of ELCA Bishops and pastors on a trip to Palestine and Israel. We spent time learning from Israeli religious leaders and Palestinians living in refugee camps. We met with political leaders from the Israeli Knesset and the Palestinian Authority. We visited Augusta Victoria Hospital and several Lutheran churches and schools. We toured the thirty-foot high, militarized separation barrier that cuts the West Bank off from Israel and talked with the Israeli Defense Force engineer who designed it. We spent time in a kibbutz way out in the desert north of Gaza where young Israeli families were eeking out a living.

We heard a lot of accusatory language and propaganda of all sides. But what we heard from the folks living in the kibbutz, the families struggling in the refugee camps, and children learning in the school, was a strong desire for an end to all hostilities. The ordinary folk of this Holy Land simply desire peace. This is what they long for and pray for. As followers of the Prince of Peace, let us prayerfully consider ways that we may bring peace to all those who long to live in peace.

Yes, we can pray: “O God, it is your will to hold both heaven and earth in a single peace. Let me designed of your great love shine on the waste of our wraths and sorrows, and give peace to your church, peace among nations, peace in our homes, and peace in our hearts, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.” Evangelical Lutheran Worship (pg. 72)

Yes, we can sing: I especially love Hymn #753 *Dona Nobis Pacem* in Evangelical Lutheran Worship. The Latin words of this canon are translated, “Grant Us Peace”. Ask your pastor or choir director to sing *Dona Nobis Pacem* during worship in the next week or month. # Happening This Month: February

## Jan. & Feb. Mission Action Project: Personal Care Kits—Lutheran World Relief

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- 1 bath towel (approximately 52" x 27") dark color recommended
- 2 bars of new bath size soap (4-5 oz.), any brand, in its original packaging
- 1 adult-sized toothbrush, in its original packaging\*
- 1 sturdy comb, **wide tooth**, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clipper, remove packaging

\*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope, no plastic bags or wrap.

**Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.** All items should be new and in good condition.

Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.




