Preparations for our late January brigade are in full swing! Matt Meyer, Karen Schultz, Tresa Witker, Aarin Egleston, Ted Lee (Fredonia University), Pastor Tim, Eric Corn, Anne Markowski, and I have committed to traveling to Honduras for our January brigade. We hope to have a few more join us as work schedules fall into place.

We are having two events this month to help purchase and distribute filters. We hope to see you at the events!



On Saturday, November 11 th, we need your help making (and eating!) buckeyes. Our goal is 1000 buckeyes! Buckeye making will be from 8 AM-11 AM and no previous buckeye making experience is required. You are welcome to help the whole time or just for a bit. Sign up is not required but will help us plan the event. Thanks to all who have made filter sweaters. The sweaters are a huge hit! The Fredonia team reported lots of filters wearing sweaters during their August medical brigade/filter checkup! If you are making new sweaters for me to take in January, please make the length about one inch shorter so the tip of the filter is exposed a bit so it can dry. There is concern if the tip is not allowed to dry between uses, it may harbor bacteria. The shorter sweater will still protect the filter if dropped. If you already have sweaters made, please do not modify them! We will make sure we use them on the Sawyer filters which are larger than the Filters of Hope.

We hope to see you at one of the events this month. Thank you for your ongoing support of Mission Honduras. Please keep us in your prayers as we prepare for our brigade. Please let me know if you have any questions!

Transition Team

The purpose of this communication is to bring the congregation up to speed with the Transition Team (TT) activities since the Blessing Points Ministry Workshop which was held in April 2022. There was a lot of preparation done by the TT for the workshop, but it ended without much conclusion or evidence of healing of the church. From August to December, the TT work was put on hold as suggested by the Synod leadership. In December 2022, Synod leadership met with the Church Council and the TT. We were instructed to review the recommendations made by the Synod that came from the listening posts. Also in December, Pastor Tim's status went from interim minister to being assigned as Bethlehem's part-time minister for a three-year period, taking us out of the Call Process. Pastor Tim is coming up on the end of his first year, leaving us blessed with two more years of his call. From January 2023 to present, the TT has worked on meeting the recommendations from the listening posts. A letter was sent to Sherry Krieger, Director of Leadership Development for Congregational Care at the Synod Staff, outlining the work we have done on the recommendations.

- The first step was sending a letter to the Congregation, April 2023, addressing what issues lead to the abrupt resignation of Pastor Matt, followed up with a congregational meeting. The consensus at the meeting was it was "water under the bridge," and we needed to move on.
- Another recommendation was to practice open communication. We have made the Covenant of Conduct available and have reviewed it during Church Council meetings. There has been calm, open communication at Council meetings as well as other church meetings. Pastor Tim has created a safe environment for open communication.
- We were to identify priorities for Pastoral leadership. With the resignation of Pastor Meg, Pastor Tim presented a process for lay members to help with visitation and administer communion.
- The fourth recommendation is to create intentional fellowship and to initiate new ministries the Congregation can be proud of. Pastor Tim conducts a weekly Bible Study. We participated in Pemberville Fair activities, including Bethlehem hosting a free swim day at the Pemberville Pool. The goal for next year is to have at least 4 fellowship activities. In addition, we pointed out the ongoing ministries such as Honduras, Operation Christmas Child, the Snack Pack program, scouting, sponsoring scholarships for the Bethlehem Preschool, as well as the new project of sponsoring the Ukrainian Family.

We met with Sherry Krieger on October 10, 2023. She was pleased with our progress, but encouraged us to continue with planning intentional fellowship activities. In addition, the TT is charged with continuing with the transition process. The overall goal of the TT is to honor the past, respect the present, and imagine the future. We have completed the first three focus points, Heritage, Mission, and Connections. The next focus point we will work on is Leadership, which includes what we can do to assist pastoral leadership as well as lay leadership. The final focus point is the Future. How can we re-imagine what it looks like to live our mission? Once this work is done, we will proceed with the Call Process as we get closer to the time of Pastor Tim's scheduled departure.

Adjournment: With no further business at 10:43am, Duane Peters moved to adjourn the meeting. Second, from Willie Fisher, the motion passed.

November 25, 2020 Give Thanks to God

"I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus," (1 Corinthians 1:4).



After an opening greeting, St. Paul begins most of his letters by giving thanks. Even when he is sharing a difficult word with a wayward church (Corinth), Paul still takes a moment to give thanks to God. In the First Letter to the Thessalonians, he actually encourages those who follow Jesus to "give thanks in all circumstances..." (1 Thessalonians 5:18a). Here Paul offers a word of challenge, but also a word of invitation.

Let's be honest, this is going to be a challenging Thanksgiving. When I was a kid, we would gather for Thanksgiving at my Aunt Joan's house, and everybody was there. Family, friends, and neighbors. We would watch the Detroit Lions get pummeled on the television in the garage, and then we cousins would play football in the backyard. Later, in the evening it was euchre and cribbage. There was always more than enough food. This year, things will be very different. For many of us this will not be the kind of Thanksgiving we are used to celebrating.

So, how might we move from challenge to invitation? How might we take St. Paul's words to heart, and "give thanks in all circumstances...". How might we invite others and yes, even ourselves to give thanks to God in times of discouragement and worry? As you prayerfully consider Thanksgiving 2020, for whom and for what do you give thanks to God?




