Mission Honduras: Mesias

A filter advocate is a local resident who helps organize filter distributions, filter checkups, and helps maintain the filters between our visits. These advocates are key to the success of our filters. Eugenio is our filter advocate in Valle Arriba and has seen firsthand the health benefits of the filters for those in his family and his community. During our recent brigade, he asked us to provide filters to a neighboring community, Mesias, where many are getting sick due to their highly contaminated water. He recently sent a list of households in the village and pictures of a few of the families waiting for a filter.



Our congregation has accomplished great things in Honduras by providing over 8000 people with access to clean water. However, we have more work to do as we share God's love in the mountains of Honduras. During our January 2024 brigade, I would like to distribute filters to Mesias, as well as other rural Honduran communities. If you would like to provide a family with a household water filters, you can donate through Bethlehem's online donation portal or by writing a check payable to Mission Honduras-Bethlehem and write filters in the memo line. I would also like to invite you to join us for our January 20-30th medical/filter brigade. No medical experience is needed, and you have the option of returning on January 27th if you are unable to stay the full ten days. Lastly, thank you for all the filter "sweaters", flipflops, hand towels, and other supplies you have donated for those in Honduras. Ed note: each filter and equipment costs about \$50.00.

FROM BISHOP DANIEL BEAUDOIN



May 16, 2023 Bishop's Writings Tanzania

Dear Friends in Christ, "Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and take their places at the banquet in the kingdom of God" (Luke 13:29).

We are a part of a global church, drawn together by the Holy Spirit from east and west, from north and south, to be the whole people of God for the sake of the world. Global Companions of the Northwestern Ohio Synod include: The Slovak Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Augsburg Confession in Serbia-Montenegro, the Mexican Lutheran Church, and The Dodoma Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania.

On Sunday morning, May 7, I was blessed to participate in the Consecration of newly Christian elected Bishop Ndossa of the Dodoma Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania on the grounds of the Lutheran Cathedral in the heart of Dodoma. Church leaders knew that the Cathedral, which seats 1500 people, would be too small for the event, so thousands of chairs were set up under numerous tents.

The Service of Consecration began at 8:00 a.m. and continued into the early afternoon. The estimated attendance was just over 3000 people, while countless others watched the service that was broadcast on national television across Tanzania. The preaching was powerful. The liturgy was moving. The music led by several diverse choirs was inspiring. The Northwestern Ohio Synod presented Bishop Ndossa with a Pectoral Cross and a Bishop's Ring. My role in the service was to bless the new Bishop's Mitre and place



it on his head with the Swahili words, "Kwa jina la Baba, na la Mwana, na la Roho Mtakatifu" (In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.)

At the end of the service, we were addressed by newly con-Bishop secrated Christian Ndossa of the Dodoma Diocese, Presiding Bishop Fredrick Shoo of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania, and the Vice-President of Tanzania, Philip Mpango. A time of food and fellowship on the grounds of the Lutheran Cathedral followed the Service of Consecration. This was a sacred moment that I will remember for the rest of my davs.

August Mission Action ProjectSchool Kits—Lutheran World Relief

- 4—70-sheet notebooks of wide— or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10.5" (No loose-leaf paper)
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure with a rubber band
- One eraser approximately 2-1/2" long
- 5 ballpoint pens (no gel ink), secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps, provided by the BLCW.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in the bag provided and close. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.


